

Notice of Public Hearing

The County of Ralls will hold a public hearing on March 12, 2026, at 10:00 a.m. at the Ralls County Courthouse in the County Commissioner's Office located at 311 S. Main Street, New London, Missouri, to discuss the county's submission of an application for a Historic Preservation Fund Construction Grant Program Application through the Missouri Department of Natural Resources Division of State Parks. The county is interested in obtaining input from all citizens regarding the grant application. As part of the hearing process, citizens will have the opportunity to discuss the proposed project's impact on the environment and the environment's possible impact on the project. The county needs as much local participation as possible to reflect the true desires of the community as a whole, as well as the comments on the proposed project application. The grant program has established a maximum application request of \$200,000, and the county must provide a minimum of forty (40) percent match of the requested amount.

The county is proposing preservation and repair work to the Ralls County Courthouse. The total project cost is estimated at \$918,666. The county proposes to contribute \$712,666 in cash, \$6,000 in-kind labor, with grant funds of \$200,000 needed to make up the balance. All Ralls County citizens are encouraged to attend in order to comment on the proposed activities.
