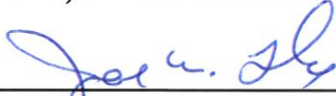

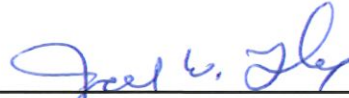

Several citizens voiced their concerns regarding Solar and Data Centers – water, electricity and power grid, noise, heat, lights, notice to surrounding property owners if property beside them is being leased or purchased, and eminent domain.

Question was asked if the citizen could vote on whether or not to have Data Centers in Ralls County. Junior Muehring said, “Our legal counsel advised that was not defensible in court. That the Planning & Zoning regulations were defensible. By addressing in Planning & Zoning can have rules and limitations, for example they supply their own power grid.
